## RESOLUTION

- Rule 3 of the Maharashtra Released Defence Services Personnel (Fixation of Pay and Seniority) Rules, 1974, privides inter alia the procedure for pay fixation of Emergency Commissioned Officers/Short Service Commissioned Officers who have been appointed against reserved posts. The provisions of this rule, however, do not cover the released Emergency Commissioned Officers/Short Service Commissioned Officers who are appointed against vacancies not reserved for them. A question has been raised whether this category of officers whould be given the weightage for their army service for fixetion of initial pay on appointment to unreserved vacancies in civil posts. It has been decided that the initial pay (but not the seniority) of the officers who are appointed to unreserved vacancies shall also be fixed according to the provisions of Rule 3 of the aforesaid Rules. For the purpose of fixation of pay of such Emergancy Commissioned Officers and Short Service Commissioned Officers who were commissioned to Army between 1st November 1962 and 10th January 1968 and were/are appointed against unreserved vacancies, the following procedure should be followed :-
- (I) IN CLEE O. PROINTHELT OF EMERGENCY COMMISSIONED OFFICERS FOR THE OFFICERS FOR INST NON-TECHNICAL POSTS.

The pay (but not the seniority) of the released Emergency Commissioned Officers/sh.rt Service Commissioned Officers who joined pre-commission training or were commissioned to the irmy between 1st November 1962 and 10th January 1968 and were/are ap ointed against unreserved vacancies, shall be fixed on the issumption that they would have been appointed to the service or posts, as the case approved military sirvice at after giving credit for their Short Service Commissioned Officer, as the case may be, including the period of training.

- The drawal of pay as determined according to the principles mentioned above shall be subject to the provisions of the Bombay Civil Services Rules, 1950. Where an officer appointed on probation is required to remain on fixed pay during the period of his probation, the pay determined according to the foregoing priciples shall be fixed for such period, and his Euture increments shall be regulated
- 3. In the case of released defence services person el who bannot be appointed to a civil service or post immediately after their release, the period of break in service upto one year between the military service and the civil service should be treated as condoned. The break in service ..... exceeding one year but not exceeding 3 years may for purpose of pension be condoned under special orders of State Government purpose of grant of nutional increments.

elso apply to the released detency services personnel melonging to all other renks (including released inrot service Regular Commissioned Officers) on their ap ointment to unreserved vacancies in the services and posts under the state Government.



These orders should take effect from 1st October 1975. The pay fix tioninall existing cases should be revised and The revised rates of pay should be allowed from 1st October 1975. No arrears on account of reflication of any as aforsaid shall be payable for any period prior to 1st October 1975.

6. The Secretariat Departments are requested to bring these instructions to the notice of the Public Sector Undertaings under their administr tivecontrol and request them to implement these instructions.
